1. Increasing confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sporting activities prioritising CPD and training where needed. TOTAL COST: Complete PE - £175	- Investment in Complete PE has significantly supported staff in delivering high-quality PE lessons. The platform provides a clear, progressive scheme of work, ensuring consistency across year groups. - Staff confidence has improved through access to ready-to-use lesson plans, demonstration videos, and step-by-step guidance, enabling teachers to deliver sessions with greater accuracy and clarity.	CPD engagement records show that while many staff access the platform, not all are using all resources available.
2. Increasing engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sporting activities TOTAL COST: - Football Competition - £30 - Sports Day Field Hire - £100 - Swimming - £1,070 (% of whole school fee)	- There has been a clear increase in pupil engagement in regular physical activity, with more pupils actively participating in both curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities. - Participation in a wider range of competitions and inter-school events has increased pupil motivation, enthusiasm, and enjoyment in PE, as well as promoting a sense of achievement and teamwork.	Continuing to broaden activity choices and target fewer active pupils will help to maximise participation and sustain high engagement levels.

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3. Raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement TOTAL COST: - Equipment: £489 - Football League: £30	- Entering teams into the West Midlands Football League has been a significant success, providing pupils with regular, competitive sporting experiences and helping to raise the profile of sport across the school. - Engagement in Varsity competition events through the Marches Academy Trust has provided pupils with regular opportunities to represent the school, fostering pride, teamwork, and a strong sporting culture. - Investment in new equipment, such as archery boards, has broadened the range of activities on offer, enabling pupils to experience less traditional sports and increasing overall engagement.	Broadening the offer to include more creative-based activities would further enhance the school's inclusive provision.
4. Offer a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils and ensure equal access to sport for boys and girls COSTS: PE Coach Time (£289 per day - £3,108)	Increased lesson time has helped to ensure greater equality of access for both boys and girls, with all pupils receiving consistent and regular opportunities to participate in PE.	Continue to build the weekly provision to ensure all pupils within the schools are getting the offer.
5. Increasing participation in competitive sport COSTS: - Minibus Hire - Competition Entry Fees - Venue Hires (Field and Sports Hall)	Engagement in Varsity competition events through the Marches Academy Trust has provided pupils with regular opportunities to represent the school, fostering pride, teamwork, and a strong sporting culture.
